Site Plan Comments:

- Additional information is the site data table as follows:
 - o Zoning: update when/if conditional district has been approved
 - o Number of units
 - o Number of buildings
 - o Maximum allowable height is 45feet
 - Number of stories and square feet per floor: Add per floor to the structure at 324
 Greenville Ave.
 - o CAMA land use classification: Watershed Resource Protection
- Will a recombination be prepared?
- Label cross access corridor easement and show dimensions
- Add height of existing fence to remain
- Add adjacent property information across Greenville Ave.
- Where will the roll out carts be stored?
- Show a proposed landscape plan.
 - o Foundation plantings on 324 Greenville Ave need to continue along the entire southeastern side of structure adjacent to the drive isle.
- Show existing tree survey.
- A tree preservation/removal permit is required
 - o Show existing landscaping and what will be supplemented in the landscaping
- Add conditional district conditions and elevations to plan set
- Add sign location
- Provide exceptional design narrative justifying the points and percent impervious over 25% for the Watershed Resource Protection
 - O Provide soil test to engineering: To qualify, soil evaluations must show that permeability is suitable for pavement to properly function to infiltrate water from rainfall into the underlying soils.
- All federal, state and local permits are required prior to full construction release. This
 includes, but is not limited to: state storm water, state utility extension permits, wetland
 disturbance permits, city storm water, tree protection permits, etc.
