Location description: The property is located at 6505 Pacific Road (Parcel No. R06212-001-002-000), in Wilmington, New Hanover County, North Carolina. The property is an undeveloped, forested lot bordering Pacific Road to the southeast, residential development to the northeast and southwest, and undeveloped, forested land to the northwest.

## A. Preliminary Determination

There appear to be waters, including wetlands, on the above described property, as depicted on the attached exhibit, that may be subject to Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (CWA)(33 USC § 1344). We strongly suggest you have the waters of the U.S. including wetlands on your project area delineated. Due to the size of your property and/or our present workload, the Corps may not be able to accomplish this wetland delineation in a timely manner. For a more timely delineation, you may wish to obtain a consultant. To be considered final, any delineation must be verified by the Corps.

X The waters of the U.S. on your property have been delineated and the delineation has been verified by the Corps. We strongly suggest you have this delineation surveyed. Upon completion, this survey should be reviewed and verified by the Corps. Once verified, this survey will provide an accurate depiction of all areas subject to CWA jurisdiction on your property which, provided there is no change in the law or our published regulations, may be relied upon for a period not to exceed five years.

The wetlands have been delineated and surveyed and are accurately depicted on the figure identified below. Unless there is a change in the law or our published regulations, this determination may be relied upon for a period not to exceed five years from the date of this notification.

- There are no waters of the U.S., to include wetlands, present on the above described property which are subject to the permit requirements of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC 1344). Basis for Determination: The property does not exhibit wetland criteria as described in the 1987 Corps Wetland Delineation Manual and the Atlantic and Gulf Coastal Plain Regional Supplement, but does contain a Relatively Permanent Water (RPW), which is jurisdictional under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. This determination is based on a site visit conducted by John Policarpo of the Corps on July 26, 2016. The enclosed figure titled, "Figure 7, Preliminary Upland/Wetland Sketch, Pacific Road, New Hanover County, NC", dated June 2016, accurately depicts the extent of jurisdictional waters of the U.S.

# A: INITIAL PROFFERED PERMIT: You may accept or object to the permit.

  authorization. If you received a Letter of Permission (LOP), you may accept the LOP and your work is authorized. Your
  signature on the Standard Permit or acceptance of the LOP means that you accept the permit in its entirety, and waive all
  rights to appeal the permit, including its terms and conditions, and approved jurisdictional determinations associated with the
  permit.
- OBJECT: If you object to the permit (Standard or LOP) because of certain terms and conditions therein, you may request that the permit be modified accordingly. You must complete Section II of this form and return the form to the district engineer. Your objections must be received by the district engineer within 60 days of the date of this notice, or you will forfeit your right to appeal the permit in the future. Upon receipt of your letter, the district engineer will evaluate your objections and may: (a) modify the permit to address all of your concerns, (b) modify the permit to address some of your objections, or (c) not modify the permit having determined that the permit should be issued as previously written. After evaluating your objections, the district engineer will send you a proffered permit for your reconsideration, as indicated in Section B below.

  you may appeal the declined permit under the Corps of Engineers Administrative Appeal Process by completing Section II of
  this form and sending the form to the division engineer. This form must be received by the division engineer within 60 days
  of the date of this notice.
- C: PERMIT DENIAL: You may appeal the denial of a permit under the Corps of Engineers Administrative Appeal Process by completing Section II of this form and sending the form to the division engineer. This form must be received by the division engineer within 60 days of the date of this notice.


